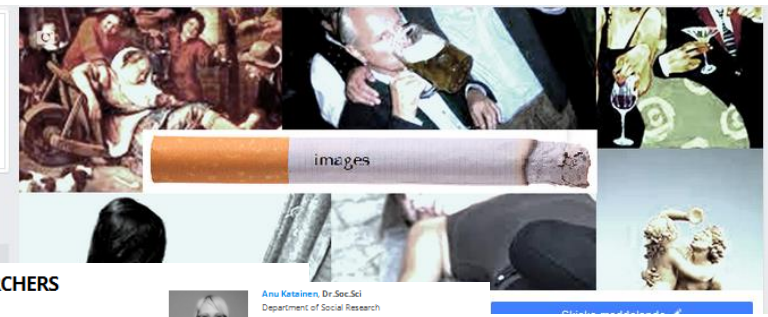

Kotanen's research interests concern sociology of law, especially legal regulation and control of violence in the private sphere, and the position of the crime victim in the context of Finnish criminal justice policy. Her PhD study analysed the legal revision process of intimate partner violence in Finland, which took place between 1968-2010. Her post-doctoral project, funded by Academy of Finland, is examining the prohibition of parental corporal violence in Finland in the early 1980s, the revisions of the legislation as well as the practical consequences of implementing these particular laws in child protection services.
